**THE MONTEVIDEO CONFERENCE**

Mr. Cordell Hull, leading the American Delegation to the Pan American Conference to be held in Montevideo, passed through Rio just recently.

His stay here was not an official one, consequently no particular functions were organized in his honour.

In the meantime, as the opening day draws nearer, rumour gets busier as to what is going to be actually accomplished.

The very fact that virtually every one of the nations represented intends to press for the acceptance of their own particular view point makes it almost certain that the practical results will be nil.

One thing seems certain that the big stick will be wielded before the end of the conference, it is possible with reactions on the head of the wielder.

**THE N. I. R. A.**

If success is to be gauged by estimating what proportion of the objective in a measure is obtained, the N. I. R. A. must be deemed a failure.

It is doubtful if more than 25 % of the good the operating of the Act was expected to secure has materialized.

President Roosevelt's honesty of purpose is beyond question but his wisdom is rather at fault.

Not only have several Captains of Industry assailed his measures but he is now losing the support of his principal advisers, his best men, whose strong, outspoken criticism of his policy has greatly disturbed the administration.

Where America is concerned, the outlook is decidedly gloomy.

Not even has the recognition of the Soviet Republic proved a successful red herring.

The pact with Russia threatens to prove a frost, as the provision of purchasing funds by the U. S. A. is a matter of more than a little difficulty.

## THE COMMERCIAL ASSOCIATION AND THE MINISTER OF FINANCE

The all-important question of the day led to a Deputation from the Commercial Association of Rio de Janeiro waiting on the Minister of Finance, Oswaldo Aranha.

The Deputation stressed the difficult position commercial houses found themselves in by the recently-promulgated decree re. Brazilian Gold-value, being made retrospective.

They urged that all merchandise shipped, in transit, or in the Custom house should be dealt with under the old scale.

The Minister pointed out the reasons that led to the issue of the Decree but promised to give full consideration to the suggestions made, always keeping in mind National and private interests.

## THE MILREIS — GOLD QUESTION

The Government complies with the suggestion from the Commercial Association of Rio.

Mr. Oswaldo Aranha, Minister of Finance, transmitted a note to Mr. João Daudt d'Oliveira, Director of the Commercial Association in Rio, advising that the Government had favourably considered the proposals advanced by the Association's Committee to maintain at 6\$200 the vale-ouro for merchandise deposited in custom-posts or arriving up to Dec. 31st, 1933.

This resolution grants partly the requests which asked for repeal of the recent Decree increasing to 8\$000 the value-ouro or for a 90 days allowance on merchandise stored or in arrival.

## NEW DECREE RE. CURRENCY

By the terms of a new Decree just published, it is stipulated that all payments and collections made in Brazil shall be made in local, legal currency thus eliminating all trouble re. the question of gold or foreign currencies:

### DECREE

Article 1st: — Any stipulation or contract based on gold payment, or on a determined kind of currency, or whatever other procedure tending to oppose, limit or restrict the course of paper milreis, is herewith annulled.

Article 2nd: — From the date of this Decree all contracts stipulated under Brazilian jurisdiction are forbidden to be based on any currency which is not the current Brazilian currency, — legal value — under penalty of voidance.

Article 3rd: — The present Decree will be effective on the date of publication. Its text shall be transmitted to the Interventors for immediate publication, all dispositions to the contrary being revoked.

## 15/— TO 45\$000

The Chief of the Provisional Government of the United States of Brazil, taking into consideration the fact that with the gold Milréis fixed at 8 mil paper, the fiscal charges etc. on coffee would increase the 15 shilling tax excessively, has Decreed as follows:

### DECREE

Art. 1st — From the date of this decree the 15 shillings tax collected by the Departamento Nacional do Café, under the terms of Decree N.º 22.236, Article 1st, of December 19th, 1932 and Decree N.º 22.542, art. 4th, of February 10th, 1933, will be taken at a fixed rate of Milreis 45\$000, national paper money.

Art. 2nd. — As to the sales registered at the Departamento Nacional do Café after publication of Decree 23.480 of Nov. 21st, 1933 and up to this date, the difference between the amounts paid and the rate hereby fixed and made lawful will be returned to the interested parties, upon request.

Art. 3rd — Dispositions in contrary are herewith revoked.

## NORWAY BUYS ORANGES FROM BRAZIL

The great potentialities in the orange trade of Brazil is seen by the remarkable increase in the exports to Europe.

To Norway, for instance, the present year shows 4.000 cases despatched, compared with about 300 cases last year.

What is definitely needed to capture the European market is efficient transportation, by which is meant, fast, regular service in well-ventilated steamers.

Of course the question of grading and packing must not be lost sight of.

## LONDON FINANCIAL POSITION

Nov. 17th, 1933

### COMTELBURO AIRMAIL SERVICE

The overshadowing event of the past week has been the further depreciation of the American dollar to the lowest point recorded since the early days of the war when, it may be recalled, the quotation was scarcely tested by ordinary business and the market was quite nominal. The belief is rather stronger that the American Administration will go on raising the price for purchases of domestic gold until 41.34 dollars per oz. is reached, by which the gold value of the dollar will be reduced by 50 per cent. It is very evident, however, that the depreciation of the dollar in terms of foreign currencies — francs, sterling, etc., — is not solely due to America's gold policy. A very important factor is the flight of capital from America that is now in progress, while a rather disturbing development is that the Secretary of the U. S. Treasury has been granted two months' leave of absence and the under-Secretary has resigned. Whether this means a difference of opinion in regard to the President's monetary policy is not stated. It is reported that Roosevelt aims at control of the world's gold market with a view to a general rise in commodity prices that would benefit humanity as a whole, but it is to be noted that so far the uncertainty as to the future of the dollar appears to have caused considerable selling of commodities, among other things, so that the hoped for rise in prices that is to restore prosperity to the world, including the U. S. A., has yet to be experienced.

In the meantime, the wild movements in the American dollar are likely to have a prejudicial effect upon our trade, and they may prove to be very embarrassing to France. French francs have also depreciated in terms of sterling, despite any selling of dollars there may have been in order to buy francs and thus acquire gold in France. It is reported that American purchases of the metal abroad will centre upon Paris, and as that market has lost a considerable amount already, there is at least the possibility that France will be driven off gold, an example that would almost certainly be followed by the other gold standard countries, thus paving the way to a world-wide re-valuation of gold in terms of each country's currency. Then, perhaps, the world would obtain that stabilization necessary to freedom of international trade, but the intervening period is likely to witness a continuance and perhaps accentuation of the present disorganisation and uncertainty. On the other hand, it is stated that recent heavy withdrawals of gold from France have been only partly on American account.

The influences operating in Stock Markets have thus been unfavourable for the most part. The vagaries of the dollar induced the closing of speculative positions in London, and a certain amount of selling

on American and French account has taken place, though at times American buying of our equities appeared to represent one form of the flight from the dollar.

Not much attention is paid to the hardening of discount rates in London, the reason for which has been explained in a previous letter, but it has had some influence upon short-dated British Government securities. Although the result of the elections in Germany was a foregone conclusion it encouraged discussion of what this development may portend, and finally there is the prospective breaking-up of the Disarmament Conference. From our standpoint these political and economic clouds are particularly disappointing because Great Britain was making a steady recovery, as indicated by the October board of Trade Returns and the increases in railway earnings.

Improved profits have been reported by several industrial undertakings, but the effect of the prolonged depression is still being felt in some directions, as witness the absence of a dividend on British India Steam Navigation shares for the first time in the Company's history of 77 years. The business is owned by the P. & O. and the latter is again unable to make any distribution on its deferred stock for the past year. In regard to shipping matters some sensation was caused by the disclosure that the losses of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Co. amount to approximately £11,000,000, as far as they have been ascertained. The stocks of the Co., became a nominal market on the announcement, for the directors say that the ordinary and preference capital amounting to £8,800,000 must be regarded as lost.

The general weakness of the London Stock Mar-

kets recently was not due to anything in the nature of panicky selling. Very largely it represented a judicious lightening of the speculative position, while as regards gilt-edged stocks considerable effect was created by sales of the new India Government 3 1/2 per cent loan by the "stags" who received a much larger allotment than they had expected. A result was that at one time this particular loan was quoted at fully 2 discount on the issue price of 97, and scrips of other new loans weakened in sympathy.

An unusually severe decline occurred this week in Brazilian Government bonds, but the movement was out of proportion to the amount of stock sold. For some time the market has been very nominal, so that a little selling, on French account partly, had a pronounced effect. The ostensible reason for the weakness is that Brazil's foreign trade may be seriously affected by the new French tariff. In the circumstances no effect was produced by the announcement at the opening of the Constituent Assembly that the arrangements made under the authority of Sir Otto Niemeyer for the resumption of the service on the foreign debt have been virtually accepted.

The past week has also witnessed a fresh fall in Argentine railway stocks, especially the prior charge issues, following the issue of further annual reports and the statements at the annual meetings. The Chairmen of the B. A. & Pacific and the Central Argentine referred to the competition of the State-owned railways, and apparently the former Company has been particularly signalled out for attack, the Chairman's speech referring to the necessity of meeting rate cuts by the Government line and the decision to build a new State railway into an area at present barren that will merely divert traffic from the B. A. & Pacific, which it will parallel.

In more than one direction security values have been adversely affected by a fall in commodity prices. These include shares of base metal mining companies, while oils have been depressed by the fear that the unsettled conditions in America may retard the plan for placing the industry there on a more satisfactory basis. Rubber has kept up very well, but there is little activity in the share market, while gold-mining issues have reflected the fall in the London price of the metal caused by the depreciation of the French franc.

anxiety here. Java shipments for October were 119,000 tons against 143,700 tons a year ago. Plantation rubber was rather firmer on some trade buying by American manufacturers and outside support. Smoked sheet, on the spot, sold up to 4 5/32d per lb. but the market closed rather quieter on the receipt of the American consumption figure for October this being given as 31,900 tons against 35,686 tons a month ago. In the tea market common and low medium Indian sorts sold well at firm rates whilst good medium and fine kinds were mostly steady. Common Ceylons were also firm but the better grades were irregular and generally favoured buyers. Java tea was steady. The slight decline in tea values recently noted was not unexpected in trade circles, following as it does a prolonged period of strength and rising prices. The position is much sounder than it was at the beginning of the year, the improvement being due to the operation of the restriction scheme. Coffee remained quiet. Good liquoring sorts sold well at firm rates but there is no interest shown in inferior descriptions. Brazilian kinds were dull and easier; superior Santos, prompt, quoted 35s per cwt, f. o. b. Cocoa was dull and easier. The decline was partly due to a reduction in freight rates from West Africa, but also to American weakness; Accra, good fermented, January-March shipment, sold down to 19s per 50 kilos, c. i. f..

The wide fluctuations in the value of the dollar-sterling exchange rate, and their repercussion on the exchange value of other world currencies, has again proved a serious deterrent to trading in many Produce Markets. Sugar was acutely affected by these conditions and prices fell sharply as a consequence. **FRUIT** — Liberal supplies of oranges met a good demand at steady rates; South African 126's 13|— to 16|6; 150|176's 12|— to 17|—; 200|226's 14|— to 17|—; 252|360's 14|9 to 17|6; Brazilian 126's 13|— to 14|6; 150|176's 15|6 to 17|6; 200|226's 17|6; 200|226's 17|6 to 19|6; 252|324's 20|— to 21|6; new Malaga 15|— to 16|9 and new Jaffa (Clementine) 126|168's 8|6 to 11|6. Grape fruit—Fair demand at steady prices; new Jaffas 14|— to 16|—; Jamaica 15|— to 19|—; Porto Rico 9|— to 17|6. Bananas steady; Canary 12|— to 14|6 per crate; Jamaica 9d to 11d and Brazilian 6d to 8d per dozen. Imports from Brazil last week comprised 32,000 bunches of bananas and 47,000 boxes of oranges.

Africans hides were dull and dry first Capes sold at 6 3/8d, with seconds at 5 3/8d per lb. Nigerians sold down to 5 7/8d for 12 lb., and up.

### JAPANESE INTEREST IN BRAZIL

Japanese penetration in South America—along cotton industrial lines — has received a decided impetus through the decision of certain Japanese mill-owners to open up mills in the Argentine.

As the next step, we are informed, they intend to establish themselves in this country.

Brazil has already a strong Japanese colony, and as the little men of Japan prove admirable citizens, an increase in their numbers should prove welcome.

## THE MINERAL INDUSTRY OF BRAZIL

### DIAMOND MINING

During the Extracção period diamond mining was carried out on an intensified scale with from 3,000 to 5,000 slaves divided into gangs of from 250 to 300 men. In this way 14 or 15 "Serviços" were attacked simultaneously in widely separated areas.

During the dry season attention was devoted mainly to the river beds of the Jequitinhonha and Parauna rivers and their tributaries. The tributaries excepting the Rio Inferno, did not generally offer any difficulties and were soon exhausted. The Contractors had in fact, only left a few virgin sections at infrequent intervals but their operations had demonstrated that the diamantiferous areas extended upstream, in some cases, to the extreme source of the rivulet under exploitation. In the case of the Rio das Pedras, Caldeirões and Guinda rivers diamonds were found to occur on the northern slope of the Chapada near the apex of the water bed and resulted in opening up an extensive area of alluvial mining for the wet season when the Jequitinhonha and Parauna rivers could not be deviated owing to floods. On the Chapada water had to be impounded in convenient depressions and led where required. The system in this instance had to be modified to suit the circumstances. The water was brought, led to and concentrated on one spot to undercut the gravel, the operation being assisted by a section of the gang armed with crowbars. The gravel was allowed to flow down a convenient channel to produce a natural concentration, the operation being assisted by raking the concentrates upstream. At the end of the season the concentrates, which by this time probably extended some hundreds of yards down stream, were laboriously gathered, and washed in a "baco" or "fervedouro". (This system of mining, which is still in vogue in the district, involves a prodigious effort for a very uncertain return and is one of the least commendable methods evolved by the Bandeirantes. An insufficient rainfall generally involved the abandonment of the operation for renewal in the following year).

The Extracção Real flourished for a number of years and reached its zenith early in its career, after which the production declined until operations began to involve a loss. João Fernandes Jr. had sent so many diamonds over to Europe that the

market was flooded when the Extracção commenced. The cost of mining was partly covered by drawing on Lisbon for funds but the drafts were not always promptly honoured and resulted in dissatisfaction among the slave owners who were already peeved at receiving a purely nominal consideration for their slaves. Successive cuts in the contract price had reduced the original sum of 1\$500 to 625 reis per slave per week. The local administrators were only allowed the modest sum of 500,000 cruzados to cover expenses payable out of the revenue of the district and 50:000\$000 in case of need payable by drawing on Lisbon. The total sum involved did not exceed 250 contos in the currency values of the time.

Officially the Contract System lasted until 1841 but its career was subjected to fluctuations occasioned either by over production, losses in mining, or political changes abroad, due to the Napoleonic wars. The district of Diamantina, however, played its part in the European turmoil by furnishing 1,000,000 cruzados worth of diamonds as part of the fine payable by Portugal to France in 1801.

The Extracção also furnished 40,000 carats annually from 1775 to 1788 to cover the terms of a contract with certain merchants in Amsterdam.

From 1772 to 1843 the production is stated to have been 1,354,770 carats an average of approximately 19,000 carats per annum. It is affirmed that there were only 80 diamonds exceeding 17 1/2 carats in weight in the quantity mentioned.

The Extracção extended its operations to the Grão Mogol region where mining at first proved profitable but afterward resulted in a loss.

CROP & WEATHER: — The weather has improved in all producing zones, but the crop as a fact is smaller and in some districts has nearly been finished. Everything indicates that present crop figures will not pass 1.200.000 bags, i. e. 300.000 bags below figures of the two previous crops.

MARKET & PRICES: — As it usually happens our market is guided by the New York Cocoa Exchange and is now also influenced by the fluctuations of the \$ not only regarding the international exchanges but also the parity in Milreis, which was subject to great oscillations.

Business has been done on Superior to New York up to 4 3/4 c and to Europe up to 22/6. In spite of yesterday's fall, our market remains steady owing to small arrivals and stocks, which are being shipped to consuming markets.

BAHIA MARKET POSITION: — We calculate that during this month besides the Bahia receipts of about 40.000 bags and 28.000 bags in stock and afloat at Ilhéos, about further 60.000 bags will arrive; during December perhaps 180.000 bags, January 120.000 bags, February 50.000 bags, March 30.000 bags and April 10.000 bags, i. e. a total of about 450.000 bags, of which we estimate about 250.000 bags already being sold for shipment during November to March, thus remaining unsold about 150.000 bags only.

We like to call attention to the fact that all these estimates are simply guess-work.

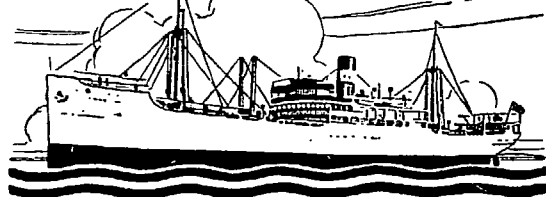
