sion of national industry; verbal communication from the General Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs replying to the Council advising that on the 14th August the Brazilian Ambassador in Buenos Aires was successful in obtaining exemption of additional duties on imports of pine wood; Letter from Messrs. Anderson Clayton & Co. Ltd. of S. Paulo regarding the inclusion of cotton by-products in the retained exchange; Letter from the Canadian Trade Commissioner giving the address of a Canadian firm who wished to import Brazil nuts; Telegram from the Interventor of the Acre acknowledging receipt of a communication from the Council regarding the reduction of the exchange quota on wool exports; Telegram from important tobacco exporters of Rio Grande asking the intervention of the Council in respect of retained exchange on exports of tobacco, in view of the measures adopted by European markets, especially Germany; A representation from the National Association of Coffee Exporters regarding marine freights.

Attention was called to a communication from the Brazilian Chamber of Commerce in Berlin of regarding the development of artificial wool in Germany, which threatens to replace the natural wool that Brazil is at present exporting to that country in large quantities.

Referring to Counsellor Euvaldo Lodi's report on his visit to the Argentine, Technical Adviser Valentim Bouças drew attention to the question of maritime transport to that country and the apparent boycotting of the Lloyd Brasileiro.

He alluded to the possibility of the Lloyd Brasileiro suspending the call at Victoria, which would increase the difficulties of exporting coffee from the State of Espirito Santo.

He also mentioned the lack of co-operation both in transport and agriculture.

The rest of the afternoon was taken up by Counsellor Euvaldo Lodi's report on the present immigration law, with various alterations and suggestions. The report was passed on to the Government with the further suggestion that a new law be made as soon as possible, even if it necessitated changing the Constitution. Counsellor João Maria de Lacerda stated that he believed the question could be resolved by a simple act of Government giving the true interpretation of paragraphs 6 and 7 of article 121 of the Brazilian Constitution.

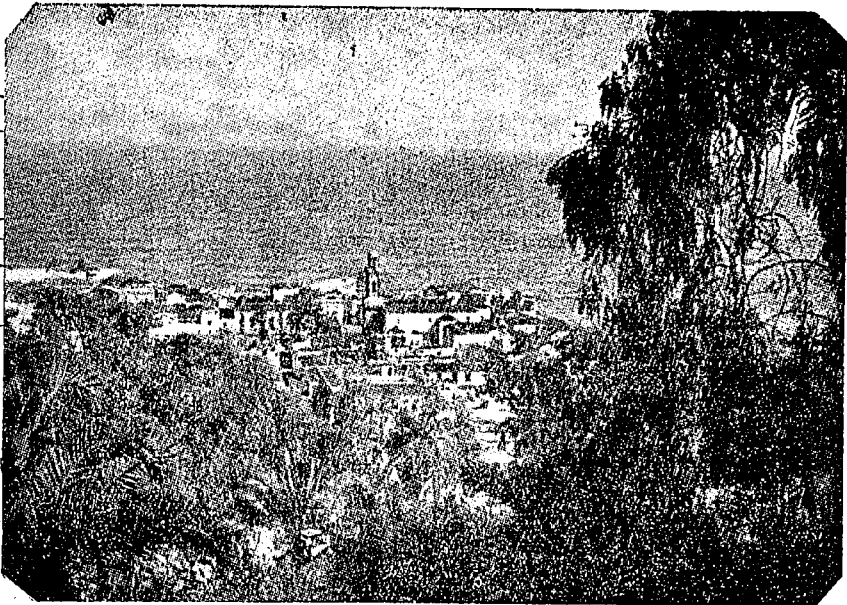
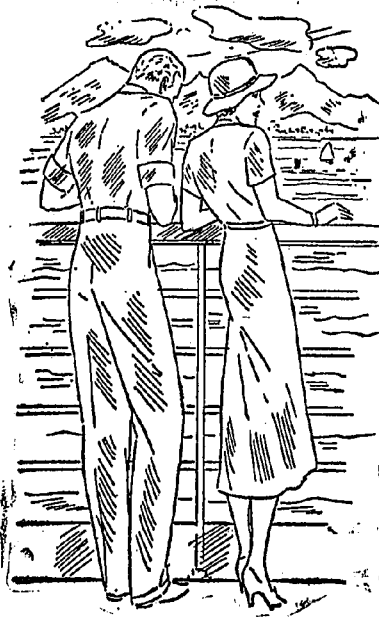
Minister Sebastião Sampaio then made a short speech congratulating Counsellor Euvaldo Lodi on his report.

Silvester, Vice-President of that Company was host to President Getulio Vargas, Sr. Gustavo Capanema, Minister of Education, and other government officials, who were there to witness the unveiling of a plate, commemorating the inauguration of work on new water mains which will convey more than sufficient water from the dam down to Rio de Janeiro's city reservoirs, to supply the ever increasing population for the next 25 years. Minister Capanema was the principal speaker at this ceremony and referred to the impro-

The weekly session of the Federal Council of Council of Overseas Trade was held on Monday last under the Presidency of Counsellor Luiz Piza Sobrinho and the Executive Director Minister Sebastião Sampaio. The following members were also present; Counsellors João Maria de Lacerda, Euvaldo Lodi, Victor Viana, Arthur de Carvalho, Alberto Boavista and Raul Leite; Technical Advisors Leo de Affonseca, Franklin de Almeida, Valentim Bouças and Misael Lima Modiano.

The minutes of the session held on the 23rd November having been duly approved, the weekly subject matter was read, which included; communication from the Chamber of Propaganda and Commercial Expansion of the State of S. Paulo acknowledging receipt of a telegram from the Council referring to the enquiry into the expan-

vement made in the water supply and sewer systems of Rio since President Getulio Vargas became Chief of the Nation. He pointed out that the last increase in water supply for the Federal District was made in 1907 and 1908, when water from the Xerem, Mantiqueira and Rio Grande rivers was used for the city's consumption. These improvements were to give enough supply for the population for 15 years only, or up to 1923.

Under President Vargas the Acary Plant was constructed for the purpose of reducing the high pressure on two aqueducts, where formerly much water had been lost, due to breaks, and leaks. At this plant electric pumps of 700 h. p. were installed. This resulted in an increase of 19 million litres of water to the city daily. Another pump has just been installed, which will have raised the supply of water to the city from the São Pedro river to 20 millions. This latter work will be finished by the end of December. Other work was done on the Acary plant and other places, with a total additional water supply to Rio of nearly 40 million liters, costing 2,440 contos. Another measure started under President Vargas' administration, was the installation of water meters in all residences, whereas formerly, they were limited to business houses. In this way much water formerly unnecessarily wasted by house wives, etc., was saved.

The final step for adequate water supply is that which is being started now, which will raise the amount of water from 300 million of daily liters to 450 million. The expenditure on these works would amount to 87.105 contos, and termination has been set for April 21, 1938

Mr. C. A. Sylvester made a short speech at the luncheon which followed the ceremony. He said that the Light was pleased that the new project had brought the President and other dignitaries to the great power dam of Lages, belonging to the company. He said the company had dedicated itself to the progress and bettering of Brazil since its beginning in 1899. He said the company's only purpose in accepting the contract to furnish water for the city, was to give all cooperation to public authorities of Brazil and better serve the city of Rio de Janeiro. Mr. Sylvester ended by paying high tribute to President Vargas and his administration.

In answer to Mr. Sylvester, President Vargas said he felt free to accent the hospitality of the Light & Power Company as the latter owes nothing to the Government which on the contrary had up til now only put more burdens on the Company, such, as pensions and retirement fund for employees of the Light Company, and the withdrawal of the gold clause from light and power rates.

He said the Light Company had always obeyed the laws passed and never solicited favors from the Government that were illegal or unjust.

He added that government measures taken which may have caused losses to Light Company and other foreign companies, were not conceived with the idea of hostilizing foreign capital, but were the consequence of administrative necessities.

The president terminated his speech by affirming that he would never attempt to combat foreign capital, because he realized that the country needed it, being a nation with little capital but rich in natural resources.

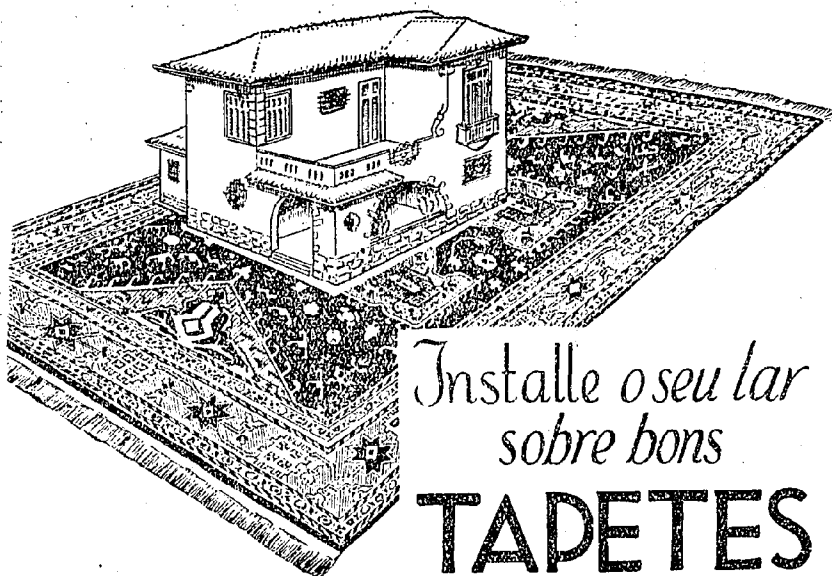

creases, but these were more than offset by lower exports to Finland, Germany, Switzerland, Portugal, Spain, Italy and Roumania. The increase in imports was spread over a large variety of goods, timber and timber products being an important item in the case of the Baltic countries.

The decline in British exports to Italy somewhat exceeded the reduction of imports from that country. Shipments to Russia, Finland, Denmark and Poland during the first nine months of 1936 exceeded those for the pre-slump year, 1929. The value of British purchases from Finland, Poland and Roumania also exceeded those for the corresponding period in the pre-depression year, 1929. Great Britain's trade with Germany in 1936 is, however, still only about half of its value in 1929.

As for Great Britain's trade with countries outside Europe, this falls into two categories; (1) British Dominions and Colonies, and (2) other non-European countries. British imports have almost recovered to the pre-depression level, but the home country's shipments to the Empire this year are still appreciably smaller than in 1929. South Africa, owing to the prosperous gold-mining industry, takes first place as Britain's most important Empire customer, displacing India, which now ranks second.

Britain's import and export trade with non-European countries shows an appreciable expansion as compared with 1935, but the value of British shipments to these countries in 1936 was less than half those of 1929. British imports from all these countries, except Mexico, Chile, Bolivia and Argentina, were higher than a year ago. There was also some improvement over 1935 in British exports to these countries, but exports to Turkey, Iran, Japan, Mexico, Chile and Brazil show a decline. A feature in this section is the appreciable expansion of British trade with the United States, which reflects trade recovery in the Western hemisphere.

THIRTY FIVE YEARS AGO

Local items. A second line of the Central Railway from Queimados to Belem of 13 kilometers extension, was opened for traffic.

— The Minister of Finances has solicited the cooperation of the Governor of Amazonas in obtaining the annulment of the contract for the lease of certain water fronts to the Manaus Railway Company.

The sale of the Sorocabana Railway by auction is announced for the 27th inst. This sale is for the payment of creditors, represented by the London and Brazilian Bank.

— In view of the action of the State Government of Minas Geraes, which has annulled the charter and guarantee of interest of the Oeste de Minas Railway, German creditors have solicited the intervention of the German Government.

São Paulo. A company has been organised for the shipment of frozen meat.

— During the 11 months ending the 30th. ult., 68,522 immigrants arrived in the State and in the same period 33,470 emigrated. Of those that arrived the State paid the passage of 48,488.

BRITISH FINANCE AND COMMERCE

BY ROBERT MACKAY

There was a marked improvement in Great Britain's overseas trade for the month of October last. The total value of imports reached the highest monthly level since November, 1931, while the total value of British exports for the same month has not been surpassed in any month since November, 1930. Almost every country shared in the increase in Britain's imports, and in this respect the present position is similar to that of several decades past. But in the last two or three decades, and especially since the War, Britain's overseas markets for her exports have undergone considerable change. Some attempt will be made here to show the different channels into which British exports now flow and to indicate some, at least, of the reasons why they should flow in certain directions rather than in others.

Most of the causes that have affected the trend and distribution of British overseas trade had their immediate origin in the War and in peace-time repercussions. But many of these trends had revealed themselves before the War, which in certain cases only served to accelerate the pace of these changes. Economic nationalism, i. e. the desire of a country for self-sufficiency, is a case in point. The War greatly stimulated this movement. Other prominent factors that have impeded the free and universal flow of trade between countries in the post-War world have been the mal-distribution of gold and the suspension of foreign lending. These two causes in particular have brought about the secondary conditions of exchange restrictions in all their manifold forms. Besides these difficulties there now seems to be the threat that the differences in the ideologies of certain governments may cause

further divergencies in the natural flow of trade. Be that as it may, British overseas trade has undergone many modifications in volume and direction in the past few years, and whether or not the former era of universal trade can return, there is great scope for improvement in world trade before really prosperous conditions can prevail throughout all lands.

While the volume of imports into Great Britain is now practically as high as in 1929, and purchases of raw materials are substantially above the pre-depression level, British exports, on the other hand, are still only about three-quarters of their 1929 volume. The discrepancy is, of course, made up by Great Britain's large "invisible exports", such as shipping, insurance, banking services, & c. Nevertheless it is interesting to note certain changes in the last few years in the imports into and exports from Great Britain in her dealing with other countries.

A well-known British economic journal, "The Economist", has compared British overseas trade for the first nine months of this year, with the same period of last year (1935) and the years 1933 (marking the beginning of revival) and 1929, the last pre-slump year. From a study of these statistics certain salient features are soon evident. Taking the European countries alone, one notes first the almost general increase in Great Britain's imports. Among the larger Powers only two countries, Italy and Russia are shown as having sent Great Britain a smaller volume of commodities. British exports, too show numerous in-

ILHÉOS: —

At present the s/s "Thule" is loading down there, due to sail for New York about 13th inst.

CROP & WEATHER: —

Weather conditions continue normal. Harvestings will finish at the end of this or the beginning of next month. Receipts in the interior are very small and everything indicates that total yieldings of the present crop will not exceed about 1.750.000 bags.

MARKET & OFFERINGS: —

The situation locally and in the interior is very disturbing and increasingly aggravating on account of defaults on part of farmers and dealers which fact demands very cautious acting unabling us to make further offers for cocoa of the present crop unless with merchandise actually in stock. All exporters are trying to buy as much cocoa as possible in order to accumulate a sufficiently large quantity to face the enormous defaults, however, purchases are very difficult, as the crop is almost all sold. As a consequence of this dilemma local prices have advanced rapidly. On the other hand there is a very good demand but we think that recently no sales have materialized, every exporter assuming a reserved attitude awaiting in the first place the cocoa to become available.

NEW CROP: —

The greater part of producers availed itself of the present price level to sell a part of their 1937/8 crop yields and the constant rise on the New York Cocoa Exchange enabled exporters in placing such purchases immediately with New York buyers, thus guaranteeing their operations with farmers for delivery 6 or 9 months ahead. Some business was done up to about 10½ cents c. & f. New York July/September shipment.
