THE formal opening of the first republican the Boa Vista palace, S. Christovao, A. bare quorum of the two houses was present, and very little interest or enthusiasm was manifested. After the usual formalities, the President's message was received and read. The document is considerably longer than its monarchical predecessors, but in character and composition it very much resembles them, being devoted to a general exposition of the work which the executive proposes to promote in congress. No state ment of the financial situation, nor of the administration of public affairs, was given

In view of the urgent necessity of legis-lation for almost every branch of the gov-ernment, to give practical and beneficial effect to the new institutions adopted, it is to be hoped that the representatives who are opening the first national republican as sembly this week will not only get to work at once but will receive the hearty coopera-tion of every patriotic Brazilian in giving practical effect to their deliberations. There is no time for politics nor for personalities; there is not even time for the work which must be done at once. Even a partial list of the subjects for legislation fills one with the subjects for legislation fills one with dismay. There is the municipal government of this city to organize, the pension and dowery questions of the late imperial family to settle, the department of justice in all its various ramifications to reorganize, the several questions of taxation to solve together with the equitable division of revenues with the states, the province of the new department of public instruction to define, the complications connected with

treaty to consider, the coasting trade to regulate, the currency and banking acts to reform, and the first annual budget of the republic to enact. When one remembers republic to enact. When one remembers how slow the progress of legislation always has been in Brazil, how new and impracticable many of the legislators are and how difficult and extensive the task before them really is, he can not help feeling disheartened at the prospect. The work must be done, however, and we trust that no time will be lost in getting some of these measures under way at once. measures under way at once

THE Pará "revolution" of the 11th appears to be nothing more than the drun ten mutiny of a lot of insubordinate soldiers. The 15th battalion has a very bad character and has frequently given trouble. Through lax discipline and weak officers, the soldiers have been allowed to spend their time in Para as they pleased, getting drunk in low saloons, quarreling with the police and even assulting peaceable citizens. The tecent murder of a policeman in the pub-lic street was committed by one of these soldiers. Through their insubordination soliters. Through their insubordination and turbulent behavior, they have kept the people of Pará in alarm for a long time, the government apparently doing nothing to restrain their disorderly conduct. On the 11th they appear to have resolved upon the 11th they appear to have resolved upon open mutiny, and would have succeeded had it not been for the naval force and the prompt action of authorities and citizens. We are inclined to believe that the affair was less serious than reported, for it is inconceivable that a pitched battle could have occurred without someone getting killed. A few wounded, a handful of prisoners picked up the day after the mutineers dispersed, a triumphal procession over a victory won in capturing empty intenchments a half day after they had been abandoned—and the whole story is told. If Brazilian officers would be more attentive to their duties and less interested in partizan politics, these shameful outbreaks would be less likely to occur. The army is recruited from the very dregs of society, often from the prisons, and it is necessary, often from the prisons, and it is necessary, therefore, that the most rigid discipline should be maintained. If the officers are inattentive and insubordinate, they certainly cannot expect anything better from their men. In our opinion, it is a serious mistake to keep the military force in large cities, where everything tends to relay distake to keep the military force in large cities, where everything tends to relax discipline. The whole force should be kept in country encampments and under strict military discipline.

That the friends of the late Reverend did not accept this my offer and that they transported the sick man to Carson's Rotel is a point, which I deem unnecessary to elucidate.

As administrator of this establishment during the time of the sickness of said Reverend Charles Winter my conscience is clean, I have as always done my duty and fulfilled even all the extgencies, resulting from such cases and my proceedings have been correct and not brutal.

This is the expression of the truth of what has happened and is far from, what you did publish in your esteemed newspaper.

Elucidating the truth you will do justice to me the undersigned by publishing this alluded recitification.

There has been so much inhumanity shown in this city during the past summer in the treatment of yellow fever patients, that we consider it a duty to denounce it in every possible manner.—Eds. News.

The boldest flights of the imagination in stringing figures together are powerless to reach the reality. Some time ago the Fonat do Commercio occupied itself in making estimates of these liabilities. How far from the wretched truth were those figures of our contemporary, that spread alarm in the money markets of Europe! This we shall demonstrate by publishing official data, for it is not patriotism to conceal the facts in regard to this inexcusable and unprecedented squandering of public money.

Up to December 14th, 1888, contracts had been made for 377,000 immigrants to be brought into the country in the time fixed in those contracts, and between July 30th and October 24th Mr. F. Glycerio contracted for 880,000, the total amount of the subsidies to be paid being £7,141,265.15-0, or in our currency, at 27t/ per 18, 03,477,444.8445. Besides the contracts for the introduction of immigrants and for the settlement of native and forcign laborers contracts were made for establishing colonies and settling families. These contracts number 255, of which only 16 were made under the imperial government.

REVOLUTION IN PARA'.

On the 12th the Paiz published the following telegram:

PARA', 11th, 12 a. m., [received at 10 p. m.]

"A large body of persons under the direction of the opposition leaders made an attack early this morning on the barracks of the police corps in this

morning on the barracks of the police corps in this city.

The soldiers made no resistance, and, apparently from a previous agreement, nearly all joined the conspirators and, orocerting to one of the suburbs of the city, began to organize a revolutionary movement.

The government on being informed of this criminal action and of the seditious plans of the mangents, in process of execution, adopted energetic measurem.

assurgents, in process of execution, adopted energetic measures.

All the Lind and leaf forces were assembled under the command of the supreme civil and military authorities of the state.

From all points law-abiling citizens flocked to the palace and to the military headquarters, offering their services to assist in restoring order. The insurgents, while preparing for the attack, cut down the telegraph poles and destroyed the lines. On the Braganga railway they fore up the track for a considerable distance.

This state of affairs did not discourage the peaceful milabilitants of this city nor paralyze their energies.

ful milabitants of time toy two passays.

It is fervently believed that the revolutionary plot will not be successful. The state congress met to-day, as had been determined, and, among other acts, passed a resolution declaring that the majority of the people of Pará are opposed to the disruption of the union and a vote of confidence in the President of the republic, in Dr. Justo Chermout, minister of foreign affairs, and in the governor of Pará, Capt. Huet de Bacellar."

The following telegrams were received by the government:

The following telegrams were received by the government:

"PaRA, June 11th.—To the minister of foreign affairs.—The insurgents took refuge in a place called Concetção in the vicinity of the capital. The 15th battalion of infantry, a battery of the 4th artillery and a park of mitriilleuses organized with 40 national marines, a squadron of cavalry and a detachment of firemen under the command of Lieut.-Col. Savaget, with the assistance of the gunboat Charany, defeated the insurgents, after a three-hours' engagement, making some prisoners while the rest of the insurgents fed to the woods, We have to lament the loss of 6 wounded. The loss of the insurgents is unknown. At night I withdrew the troops, leaving the gunboat Cannary the cruiser Capador and two armed launches on observation to prevent the descent of canoes with reinforcements for the insurgents. All the troops displayed the utmost galantry and discipline.

The commander Savaget, the officers of the 15th, the honorary commander of the 4th and all his officers and the officers of the navy have rendered a most important service to our country. All the officers of the navy and of the national marines have distinguished themselves, displaying the utmost zeal. I make special mention of the commander, Eapt. Queiroz, whom I intrusted with the command of the whole of the naval force and the commanders of the two mitrailleuses, 1st Lieutenants Noronha and Arthur Carvalho, the latter of whom was slightly wounded on the forehead by a musket ball.

The commanders of the Guarany and Cabeaclilo and their officers were indefatigable in the performance of their duty.

I have been assured of the support of the people, who are indignant at this monstrous crime.

I shall continue to act with energy and I hope in a short time to completely restore order and tranquility in this state.— Huet de Bacellar, Governor."

"PARA, June 12th.—To the minister of foreign affairs.—I consider the seditious movement ended. The energetic measures which I have taken enable me to crush at once any attempt to disturb public tranquillity. You need have no fears. Besides yesterday's engagement which I reported to you in my telegram dated last night, nothing has occurred. The insurgents, completely routed, were paniestricken and to-day at noon they dispersed.

The land and naval forces march in triumph through the streets of the city and are hailed with acclamations by the people.

The constituent congress met to-day and many people were present.— Huet de Bacellar, Governor."

"To Barão de Lucena.—This morning I sent a squadron of cavalry to reconnoiter the insurgents' position. The latter have abandoned their intrenchments. I ordered the return of the squadron which, reconnoitering in the vicinity, captured several stragglers. I shall immediately take steps for pursuing them by sea and completing the pacification of Capim.

I can assure Your Excellency that the revolt is crushed, thanks to the land and naval forces and to the support of the people.

Many sword-bayonets and Comblain rifles were captured and some ammunition.

I congratulate Your Excellency on this brilliant result.—Huet de Bacellar, Governor."

By despatch No. 10 of May 16th ult. you deigned to ask me to indicate to you what is the disposition which, in view of the Decree No. 1,620 of February 14th of this year, should rule for the termination (prezeripfac) of the responsibility of the shareholders in a joint-stock company as to the sums which may be wanting to complete the value of transferred shares, in order to establish a fixed rule in this respect, because Art. 7, 6 2 of, the Law No. 3,150 of November 4th, 1882, marked the period of five years for such responsibility, to count from the date of the transfer, whereas Decree No. 164 of January 17th, 1890, causes it to cease so soon as the general meeting of the society shall approve the annual accounts.

In reply, it belongs to me to declare to you, that the disposition of Art. 7, 8 2 of No. 2 of the cited decree of January 17th, limiting the period of responsibility (prescripta) established by the Law of November 4th, 1882, should be observed; because, if the Decree of February 14th last restored by its Art. 13, the latter law, it also confirmed that of 1890 in all its parts and, consequently, in those which had been revoked by previous legislation, not expressly modified by it.

—The Uruguayan budget project for the fiscal year 1891-92 estimates the revenue receipts at \$15,490,500 and fixes the expenditures at \$15,246, 175. The consolidated debt of the country is stated to be \$84,481,104, on which the interest and service charges amount to \$5,963,320 per annum—over one-third the whole revenue. The total interest obligations of the country, including sundry debts, railway guarantees, etc., are \$8,720,257, or over one half of the revenue.

—An incident occurred in the bay on Thursday evening which requires explanation. A boat's crew from a Norwegian vessel was passing near the Oriental gunboat Suarez, when the sentinel of the latter, after calling out something they did not understand, not knowing Spanish, fired upon them first with blank and then with ball cartridge, one of the crew having a narrow escape. The run upon the private banks in Buenos Aires on the 1st seems to have originated in a general movement to withdraw deposits from the Provincial Bank, the people not knowing that the government had extended the suspension of payments in the two state banks. An immense crowd had collected, and when it was known that their deposits could not be obtained, a general rush was made for the private banks. All of these kept up payment most of the day, but in the end five were compelled to temporarily suspend—the Italian, New Italian, Connercio, French and Spanish. The London and River Plate Bank succeeded in meeting every demand, and no run was made on the English Bank of the River Plate.

—A telegram from Goyaz, dated the 9th inst., says that the constitution of that state has been clandestinely promulgated by the deputies.

—In the Pernambuco legislature the state constitution was adopted in the last discussion on the toth inst. and sent to the engrossing committee.

—The Alagóas constituent assembly elected the President's brother, Dr. Pedro Paulino, to the governorship after all. The governor was sworn in on the 12th.

—There are 3,600 immigrants crowded in the Rink building in Santos, and the president of the municipal council, for sanitary reasons, has asked for their removal.

—It has been stated, but is contradicted, that Gen. Aguiar Lima before retiring from the office of governor of Paraná made large grants of public lands to his friends.

—The Libertailo of Ceará complains that the telegrams it sent to the press of this city in regard to the election of the governor of that state were intercepted by order of the government.

The opposition deputies in Alagoas, some o whom remained at home to escape danger, have published a protest against the intervention of the general government in the elections of that state.

—In the Minas Geraes legislature it was decided by a large majority on the 7th inst. that the form used in the promulgation of the constitution should include the words "In the name of Almighty God."

—The validity of the election of governor and promulgation of the constitution in Sergipe is contested on the ground that there was not a quorum at the legislative sitting in which these acts were performed.

—The municipal council of Cordeiros has mem-orialized the legislature of Rio de Janeiro in favor of a constitutional provision for granting to the municipal governments the product of the tax on hou.e-rent.

—In Santos the cartmen employed by the Companhia Santista de Transportes struck on the 8th inst., demanding the dismissal of the foreman. This strike seriously interfered with the shipping of coffee on that day.

—The Rio Grande constituent assembly was formally opened on the toth, and on the 12th Dr. Miguel Joaquim de Almeida Costa was unanimously elected governor. The assembly will now proceed to the adoption of a constitution.

—Bernardino Lundgvist, a Swedish journalist, who went to Pernambuco in April to investigate the suitability of that state for Swedish immigration, reports to Barão de Lucena that he has discovered there a "paradise for his unfortunate countrymen." He probably means a way to paradise.

—There have recently been disturbances in Pará, and a telegram of the 5th substitution of the Companio de Mello was stabbed when returning home on the evening of the 8th. It is supposed that the authors of the crime are cadets of the 15th battalion. The Major's wound is said to be dangerous.

—According to a private letter from Sac Paulo

-According to a private letter from \$50 Paulo three is no scarcity of labor whatever in the district about Taubaté, the planters in some cases being obliged to send the applicants away. And the most interesting point is that these laborers are not numigrants, but are caipins [poor whites] and freedmen!

—According to Santa Catharina papers of the 5th and 6th inst. a party of nine surveyors of the Colonisadora company had been attacked by Indians on the Rio Irajahy, near the Santa Theresa military colony, and all but one were killed. A search party found eight of the men dead, and near them nine dead Indians. The survivor received an arrow wound in the neck, or arm. The reports are somewhat conflicting, and subsequent news may modify these particulars.

—On the morning of the 8th inst, a man was attacked by two threves on Rua de S. José and tobbed of 4,460\$. One of the thieves, a soldier of the 7th battalion of infantry, has been arrested. In due course of time this soldier will undoubtedly be promoted.

—Permission has been granted to Capt. Luiz Felippe Saldanha da Gama to accept and use the gold medal presented to him by the President of the United States for the part he took in saving the lives of the master, mate and one seaman of the American bark John Herzey on the night of the 21st of last November.

—A decree dated on the 6th classifies the Brazil-ian consulates-general as follows, viz: 1st class— Hamburg, New York, Buenos Aires, Antwerp, Paris, Liverpool, Genoa, Lisbon and Naples; 2nd-class—Trieste, Santa Cruz de la Sierra, Valparaiso, Copenhagen, Barcelona, Rotterdam, Asuncion, Iquitos, Geneva and Halifax.

—The last effort of the director of the Mint in the line of postage stamps (100 reis) ought to satisfy the most morbid taste for ughness. It is smaller than the former stamp and is printed in two colors—red and blue. A factor to-day is \$77 per kilogramme; that is, the custom house assumes that the average value of the coffee shipping is about 1.2\$500 per arroba which is about.
