A competent travelling salesman, he says, demands a large salary and an ample allowance for travelling expenses. His stay at each place is limited and at some of the places he will arrive too late and at others too early for doing business advantageously. In order to meet all the varying conditions of trade in different countries he is hampered in different countries he is hampered with exceedingly bulky packages of samples. and over hundreds of times by German, English and other foreign peoples.<sup>8</sup>
The difference of opinion on this subject is perhaps more apparent than real. Mr. Harper and his companions recognize the necessity of the utmost care, in selecting the proper kind of care in selecting the proper kind of travelling salesmen, who, as they cor-rectly assert, should be intelligent and rectly assert, should be intelligent and well acquainted with the goods they wish to sell and also, if possible, with the language, customs and trade requirements of the country in which they seek to do business. There are no better salesmen in the world, they say, than the American commercial drumvers. If these men will explain to South American merchants the merits of the merchandise they handle, meet the objections offered and report to manufacturers in the United States, the latter can determine what alterations it is necessary to make in their products. This is also Mr. Search's opinion, but at the same time he and the members of

This is also Mr. Search's opinion, but at the same time he and the members of the commission do not fail to recognize the importance of resident agents and of the establishment of branches of American houses or distinctively American importing houses in South American trade centres.

Giving due weight, then to all the

Giving due weight, then, to all the foregoing opinions and adding to them others with which we have had occasion others with which we have had occasion to become acquainted, as well as the results of our personal observation, we arrive at the conclusion that the travelling salesman and the resident agent supplement each other and that with the former's canvassing ability and with his knowledge of the merchandise and of the manufacturer's views it is expectation. his knowledge of the merchandise and of the manufacturer's views, it is expedient to combine the information which the latter has acquired in regard to the requirements of the local market, the methods of doing business, the standing of business men and the language and customs of the country.

#### THE WAR IN BAHIA

Col. Luiz Augusto Soares Woolf has been appointed post commandant at Queimadas and Major Manoel José de Freitas at Monte Santo. Fitty cases of small-pox were reported at Queimadas on the 3d inst. and the same number at the hospitals at Monte Santo on the 3oth ult. There were two or three deaths every day at the latter place.

Maj. Carlos Frederico de Mesquita, who is on leave at Pelotas, has been interviewed by a representative of the Correto Mercantil. He says that the government troops shoot the prisoners that fall into their hands. The fanatises, he states, die courageously, shouting «Long live Bom Jesus Conselheiro and the emperor of Brazil»

Soldiers at Queimadas are said to be selling their arms and uniforms.

#### LEGISLATIVE NOTES

Aug. 30.—Chamber of Deputies.—In discussing the proposed deficiency appropriation of 900005 for police investigations Deputy Glycerio said that he and his friends were unwilling to vote money for hiring spies and informers. Rather than contribute to the encouragement of practices degrading to any government that resorts to them, the opposition members, he added, would, if necessary, absent themselves and thus prevent the chamber from having a quorum for voting the appropriation.

Aug. 31.—Senate.—The senate concurred in the resolution of deputies for prolonging the session to Oct. 5.

Shift. 1.—Senate.—By a vote of 21 to 18 the senate adopted a motion, opposed by senator Ramiro Barcellos, requiring the committee on the constitution to report on the constitutionality of Decree n. 2.579.—Chamber of Deputies.—The bill granting certain favors to the Brazil Great Southern Railway was passed over the veto by a vote of 108 to 37. In the discussion of the budget of the department of foreign affairs Deputy Paulino Junior, on behalf of the budget committee, offered amendments reducing to 693:5005the appropriation for legations and consulates. Deputy

Augusto Severo moved to inquire how much the government had paid for the steamers Haiph and Hapeva. There was received a communication from the minister of foreign affairs stating that it is not true that the Italian government has given to benevolent institutions the sum of 900,000 liras received in payment of claims of Italian subjects against the Brazilian government.

SETT.2—Chamber of Deputies.—Deputy Serzedello moved to inquire whether the government had sold to the Brazilianische Bank für Deutschland the silver deposited in the treasury.

treasury.

SETT. 3.— Chamber of Deputies. —Deputy Serzedello's motion was adopted. The chamber sustained the veto of the bill exempting from duty unrefined petroleum imported by the Companhia International de Marahú.

SEPT. 9.—Senate.— Senator Vicente Machado, in the debate of the army bill, said that the soldiers are badly armed and equipped and that, in violation of the constitution the press-gang is used for obtaining recruits. Senator Ameda Barreto said that it is a well known fact that what has most contributed to destroy the efficiency of the army is the lack of discipline.

#### PROVINCIAL NOTES

—It is stated that one of the judges in S. Paulo is to be prosecuted for causing the arrest of Engineer Nilo Deodati at the suit of a servant who presented a claim for wages. Deodati was released in virtue of a writ of habeas corpus.

habeas corpus.

—In the State of Rio Grande do Sul, says the Artista, the constitutional provision prohibiting the use of the press-gang is lagrantly violated by both federal and castillhista authorities. This statement is confirmed by recent telegrams, which state that passengers arrived at Porto Alegre report laving seen on a flat-hout on the river Taquary 105 men whom the notorious João Francisco had arrested and forwarded for the purpose of being forced to serve in Castilhos' military brigade. João Francisco had arrested others, but Menna Barreto had caused them to be released.

#### RAILROAD NOTES

—Acording to the Philadelphia aTimes, a the Jackson & Sharp Company has received the contract to build a number of cars for the Southeastern Railway Company of London. A sample car, which was shipped from the works of the Wilmington corporation, has arrived in London, and, having met the approval of the board of directors of the European railway, the local firm has been awarded the contract for the construction of the cars. This is the first contract the company has received for cars in London. The car is fifty-five feet long, of the standard width and the regulation parlor car of this country. Entance to the car is the same as in American cars, and not at the side and into compartments, as in English cars. It is heavy in construction, the under-frame being almost entirely of iron and steel.

—British manufacturers, says an American
journal, are indignant on account of the contracts which have recently been secured by
American manufacturers amounting to mililons of dollars for the traction plant for the
London Central Underground Railway, which
is to be run by electricity. The secretary of
the company explains that the contracts for
the company explains that the contracts for
exercise to American firms on the advice of the
electrical experts, who represent that the
greater use of electrical traction in the United
States has brought its manufacture to a higher
degree of perfection and made if far less expensive than in England. The contracts for
the London Central Railway were awarded to
the General Electric Company. They call for
an extensive apparatus, and the equipment of
a system resembling that operated in the Baltimore & Ohio tunnel at Baltimore. Locomotives are to be used instead of motor cars.

—Up to the present the only particulars that

a system resembning that operated in the actions of the continuous of the present the only particulars that have been made public in regard to the proposals for the lease of the government railways are the following:—At London there was received a proposal from Messrs. Greenwol & Co. for the lease of the Central Railway. They propose, it is said, to organize a company with a capital of £5,000,00, on which the government is expected to guarantee 6 % interest besides taking half the shares. Af interest besides taking half the shares. Af Riveles there was received a tender, whose terms are not stated, for the lease of the railway from Porto Alegre to Uruguayana. At Riv de Janeiro there was also received a proposal for the lease of this road. This proposal is signed by João Pereira Parobé as secretary of the Stategovernment of Rio Grande do Sal, who, however, fails to present any document showing that he has made the proper deposit in the treasury. He offers to pay £ 33.350 in cash, £ 6.679 per annum or 10 % of the gross receipts or 20 % of the net receipts in excess of the equivalent of 12 % of the capital invested in the road and the sum of 12.0005 per annum for the cost of supervising the execution of the contract. There was likewise received at Riod Janeiro, a proposal, signed by João Thomé de Saboia e Silva and Vicente Saboia de Albuquerque, for the lease of the road besides 60000 per annum for the rocot of supervision. They require that the freight and passenger rates shall be revised every two years.

—On the 8th inst. there was a collision between two trains on the Central Railway near the station of Queluz. Both trains were very much damaged, four persons were killed and several were wounded.

—The quantity of freight handled at the Central, Gamboa and S. Diogo stations of the Central Railway in the three months ended Aug. 31 was as follows:

An exceedingly interesting and satisfactory report was presented by Mr. J. B. Kennedy (the acting president) which together with treasurer's statements and accounts, was unanimously approved.

In the election of new officers, Messrs. Genmell and Lamoureux were reappointed, and Rev. Irvine Crawshaw and Mr. T. G. Cross nominated to fill the vacancies caused by the retiral of Rev. H. Mosley and Mr. G. Gudgeon.

An interesting feature of the meeting was the special recognition of the handsome donation resulting from the Diamond Jubilee Fund, by which it was unanimously resolved, on the proposal of Mr. G. B. Kennedy, seconded by Mr. C. E. M. Taylor, to name the new isolated pavilion "The Victoria Jubilee Ward 1897." As the report and statements are in press for early distribution, it is unnecessary to anticipate their particulars, and we would simply confine our remarks to our repeated recommendation that well wishers should not fail to afford all the assistance in their power to ensure the good maintenance of the institution.

Registro Civil, 1894.—This work contains the available biological statistics of the country for the year 1894. Unfortunately, it is incomplete, for out of 2.452 districts it refers to only 1.291. In these there were in that year 164.316 births, 126.391 deaths and 35.859 marriages. Of the births 84.473 were of males and 79.543 were of females. Of the deaths 69.230 were of males and 57.161 were of females, 111.183 of Brazilians, 111.843 of foreigners and 3,365 of persons of nationalities not specified. There were 1.088 deaths of persons over 90 years old. The deaths caused by yellow fever were 4.096, of which 3.760 were in the city of Rio de Janeiro. The average marriage age was 26, 66 for men and 21, 13 for women.




