NEWS AND NOTES

—A new revolution in Venezuela was announced last week.

—Minister Epitacio Pessoa and Chief of Police Eneas Galvão have resigned.

—It is stated that Gen. Hermes da Fonseca insists on being relieved of the command of the police brigade.

—Recently on more than one occasion, it is stated, President Campos Salles has been hissed when he appeared in public.

—Among the passengers for New York by the "Buffon" on the 2nd inst. was Bishop Kinsolving, of Rio Grande do Sul, and his family.

—Three important houses are said to have suspended payments last week and the report of the intended suspension of another house was circulated.

—Among recent arrivals here, we take much pleasure in noting that of Rev. E. A. Tilly, who will be located for the next year in Juiz de Fora.

—Martial law has been suspended in Argentine and imposed in Venezuela. Popular government in South America does not seem to promote very much popular liberty.

—The article of Dr. Alberto Salles declaring the present institutions of the country a failure continues to be discussed. He has published a second article on the subject.

—By a decree of the 31st ult. the government approves the suspension of the present treaty of interest on the "Recife no Linoceiro" line, and the lease to the Great Western of Brazil Co. of the "Recife a S. Francisco" "Sul de Pernambuco," "Conde d'Eu," "Natal e Nova Cruz," "Central das Alagoas" and Paulo Afonso lines.

—It would appear that Mexico proposes to stand no nonsense in regard to the approaching Pan-American congress. In reply to an inquiry from the Argentine government, the Mexican government says that the programme will be that specified in the circular invitation sent out to various governments. If Chili is not disposed to accept this, she can stop away.

—In the chamber of deputies the proposed appropriation of 150,000 in gold for defraying the cost of taking part in the Pan-American Congress is encountering vigorous opposition. It is urged that in the present financial situation of Brazil the expenditure of so large a sum for such a purpose is preposterous and moreover that the utility of the congress is by no means certain.

—The discussions which have arisen in the press in regard to the free use of the custom-house by President Campos Salles show that the public conscience is stirring, and that the time is not far distant when a stricter accountability will be exacted of those in power. Discreditable as these disclosures are, they can not fail to serve a good purpose in the end. The government can not defy both the moral and statute laws with impunity.

—The celebration organized by the national press on the 1st inst. in honor of the Swiss republic was undoubtedly wellintended, but it was certainly in very bad taste. The cause of it was of course the decision in favor of Brazil in the Amapá dispute. But if a demonstration is warranted in this case, then we must be prepared to see every successful litigant making festas over the judge who decides in his favor. It is bad taste, and it places the judge or arbitrator in a very awkward position.

—Dr. Julio de Mesquita, editor-in-chief of the Estado de São Paulo, says the situation at which the country has arrived under its present institutions is intolerable and that it must be changed at any cost.

—Much scandal has been caused by the disclosures recently published in regard to the withdrawal of merchandise from the customhouse by President Campos Salles without payment of duty. The inspector of customs asserts that it has always been the rule to exempt from duty the merchandise imported by the head of the government but the statement is contradicted and there have appeared counter-statements showing that the Emperor, ex-Presidente Prudente de Moraes and the various vice-presidents that have temporarily held the office of president never imported merchandise without paying the respective duty.

—In both houses of congress the Pernambuco delegation displays great hostility to the contract for the lease of the Recife and São Francisco Railway, the Sul de Pernambuco Railway, the Conde d'Eu Railway, the Alagoas Central Railway, the Paulo Afonso Railway and the Natal and Nova Cruz Railway to the Great Western of Brazil Railway Co. On Saturday Senator Segismundo Gonçalves offered a resolution for suspending the execution of the contract until congress shall have passed a law for regulating the freight and passenger rates. He asserted that the terms of the leases are ruinous to the interest of people of the Pernambuco and the adjoining States and he reminded the government that an oppressed people has the right to resort to revolution.

The River Plate won the toss and went in first, Gordon Brown and Wilson opposing the bowling of F. Morrissy and Stutfield. They started badly, as Morrissy soon dismissed both Brown's, J. O. Anderson and Wilson, however, by steady play, put a better appearance to the score, and, towards the end of the innings, Fraser and Middleton gave a fine display of hard hitting, the innings closing shortly after for 141. Rio then went in and when stumps were drawn for the day had put on 95 runs for the loss of two wickets. R. Morrissy 35 and Quennell to being the not outs. On resuming on Monday, Rio gave a very fine display of batting almost every getting double figures. Gifford and R. Morrissy playing faultless innings of 56 not out and 48 respectively. The innings closed for 291, and the visitors had to bat again, 150 runs being necessary to save the innings defeat. This proved beyond their power, as Stutfield and F. In no match during their stay in Rio were the Buenos Aires XI seen to better advantage than against the R. C. A. A. at Icarahy on the 19th and 20th July. The home side, who were weak in bowling, did very well in getting the visitors out for 113, and made a fairly good start on going in to bat, 50 being on the board before the third wicket fell. On Fraser taking the ball from Messervy, however, he bowled with such deadly effect that the remaining wickets only added 21 runs. The Buenos Aires fast bowler took a wicket in every over he delivered, and his five wickets for seven runs in 27 balls was a wonderful bit of bowling. Going in again the visitors fared badly, losing 3 wickets for 6 runs when play ceased for the day. On the 2nd day little cricket was possible before lunch owing to heavy rain, and on play being resumed the batsmen took full advantage of the fielding side, who had to bowl with a wet and greasy ball. J. O. Anderson found a most useful partner in Gordon Brown, and the 61 which the pair added to the score whilst together enabled the Buenos Aires captain to declare his innings closed, leaving the Association 2 hours in which to get the 235 required to win. The first wicket of the club's second innings produced 84 runs, but, though always trying to force the pace, the batsmen found runs no easy matter to obtain, as the bowlers maintained an excellent length. When Wheatley joined Pierce runs came quicker, the newcomer, who, by the way, was quite the hero of the match in 1890, making several characteristic strokes, a hit out of the ground being one result of many mighty efforts. With Stutfield in, runs came at a tremendous pace, his 35 being the result of only 15 minutes batting. He hit seven fours, one fine square leg hit landing on the roof of the pavilion. After having all the worst of the game in its earlier stages, the home side found themselves at the close in a very flattering position, though it should be mentioned that the visitors sadly missed Fraser's bowling in the second innings.

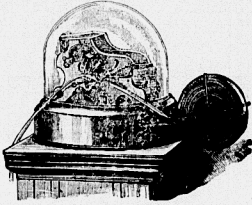
