"It was rumored last week that there were strikes on the Central Railway and at the Saltigs docks and a revolution in Pernambuco. Although the reports proved to be incorrect, it is possible that they were not altogether without foundation, for it is stated that the police force and garrison of Rio de Jaueiro were held in readiness and the palace guard reinforced.
